Irregular Plurals

Generalization - Some plurals are formed by adding -s or -es: hoofs, potatoes. Sometimes the spelling of the singular form changes: loaves, feet. Some words do not change at all.

1. videos - recorded movies or motion pictures
2. feet - the body parts one uses to walk
3. potatoes - starchy edible roots of the potato plant
4. themselves - referring to them or they
5. lives - is or remains alive
6. leaves - goes away from
7. cliffs - places where the land drops downward steeply
8. men - adult male people
9. halves - two equal parts that make up a whole
10. moose - large broad-antlered North American animal
11. radios - audio devices that broadcast sound and music
12. sheep - wool producing farm animals
13. cuffs - folded material at the end of a sleeve or pant leg
14. beliefs - ideas or statements thought to be true
15. patios - paved relaxation areas next to buildings
16. children - sons or daughters
17. tornadoes - intense wind storms shaped like funnels
18. tomatoes - round, pulpy red fruit eaten as vegetables.
19. hoofs - hard horn-covered feet of cows or horses
20. loaves - shaped units of bread or other foods
