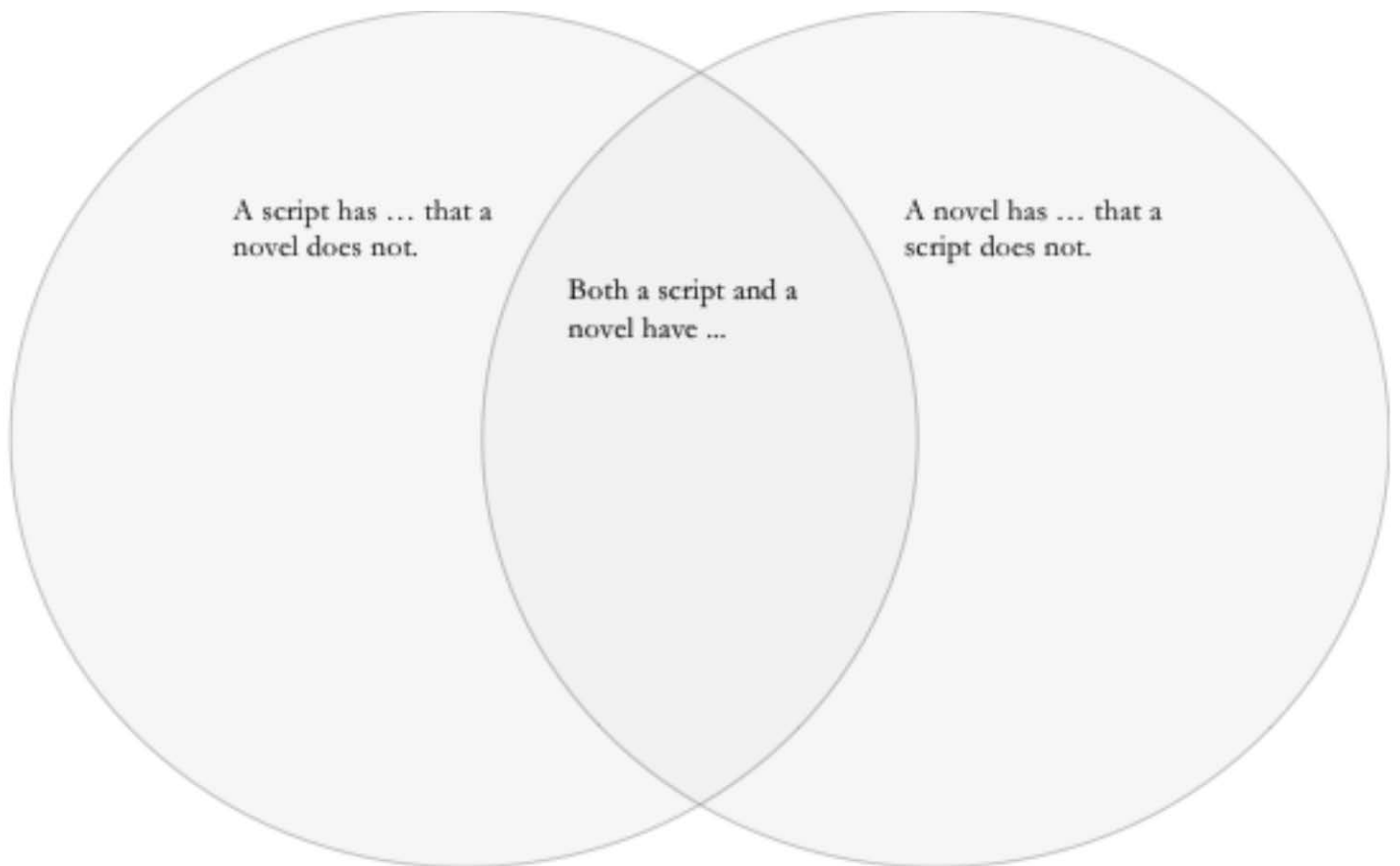




1. Compare (similarities) and contrast (differences) a script a novel by completing the Venn diagram below.

Example of a Novel We Have Read:
Esperanza Rising

Both a novel and a script have:

- *The same characters in the scene*
- *Some of the same dialogue*
- *Some of the same actions by characters*
- *The same events.*

A script has that a novel does not:

- *A narrator who is different to the characters in the scene.*
- *More dialogue – a script tells the same story through dialogue and actions.*

Next Thursday, November 2nd we will be having a brief assessment on evaluating a novel versus a script. Next Friday, November 3rd we will be having an *Esperanza Rising* Book Test. The assessment will include some information about scripts including a Venn diagram comparing and contrasting a script with a novel. We have finished reading the novel *Esperanza Rising* and will be doing an *Esperanza Rising Readers Theater* next week. The *Esperanza Rising* Book Test will include multiple choice questions, matching and one essay question. Students should have read the entire book and know the events that took place in the book. In the matching section the students will need to know the following characters.

Marta – The striker girl who is not nice to Esperanza

Isabel – The eight year old daughter of Juan and Josafina

Hortensia – Miguel's mother

Alfonso – Miguel's father

Marisol – Esperanza's best friend in Mexico

Miguel – The son of Alfonso and Hortensia

Esperanza Ortega – Thirteen year old girl who is the protagonist

Abuelita – Esperanza's grandmother and Ramona's mother

Ramona Ortega – Esperanza's mother who becomes very ill

Sixto Ortega – Esperanza's father
